CCW's President's Note: The Cromwell Oak Tree

The Central Connecticut Woodturners have the opportunity to collect the wood of a 200 year old Oak tree in Cromwell, CT. I am meeting with the town council in February to discuss how the CCW could be of help to them. This tree had become a point of difficulty for the town. The town council needed to remove the tree because it had become a driving hazard. The tree has been taken down and moved to the transfer station in Cromwell. The CCW will need to collect the tree from Cromwell on Saturday, April 1st, depending on weather conditions. I am meeting with the First Selectman on March 15th to discuss further details and go out and see the tree to get a better idea of how much wood is in this tree. I will have more details at the March CCW meeting.

Miscellaneous Business:


