January Demo by Buster Shaw

"Turning an Arched Cookie Platter---an introduction
to Interrupted Turning"



BUSTER'S NOTES & INSTRUCTION:

Material: 4/4 5/4 stock 6" to &" square. Maple or Cherry works well.

<u>Tools:</u> 1. Scroll Chuck with #2 Dove tail Jaws (Note-Profiled Jaws will mar the Turning).

- 2. Scraping tool to form a recess and dovetail.
 - 3. 3/8" Bowl Gouge.
- 4. Finish of your choice. I prefer Walnut Oil.

Before Turning:

- 1. Find the center of the stock by drawing diagonal lines from corner to corner.
- 2. Find the halfway point on all sides.
- 3. Using a compass, draw an arc with a radius the same as the width of the stock from the midpoint of each side to the opposite side.
- 4. Using a Forstner bit slightly larger than the #2 jaws of your chuck, drill a ¼" deep hole into the center of the stock.
- 5. Using the band saw, cut on the outside of each drawn arc, and then sand to the line.

<u>Turning:</u> Mount the stock on the lathe by expanding the chuck into the bored hole.

Remember to measure the chuck jaw width in the closed position when they are round.

- 1. Using a scraper, make a recess the width of the closed jaw measurement 1/8" deep, then form a slight dovetail in the recess to accept the jaws.
- 2. Using light cuts, turn a fair curve from the recess to the rim. Leave the thickness about $\frac{1}{4}$ " at the points.
- 3. Sand the turning's base and recess. At this point, a finish of your choice can be applied to the base.
- 4. Reverse the platter on the chuck. Be careful not to over tighten the chuck or as you can split the recess.
- 5. Start turning the inside from the rim to the bottom using very light cuts at 1 to 1.5 inches from the rim to the bottom.
- 6. Stop the lathe to see if the width of the edge is equal. If not, turn only at the edge until the edges are equal on all 4 sides.
- 6. Continue turning the inside. Remember that the piece has a 1/8" recess in the Bottom.
- 7. Sand and apply a finish to the inside.
- 8. Bake a batch of cookies.


